A Message from Pastor Kat

Shocking Beginnings

Advent marks the beginning of the liturgical calendar year and starts us off with a bang. As we prepare for the coming of Christ, we encounter scriptural texts that startle us with end times images, prophetic signs, and surprising encounters.

In Advent, we begin at the end and work our way backwards. First, Jesus speaks to us near the end of his life foretelling the coming of the kingdom. Then, John the Baptist cries out from the wilderness calling us to prepare for the coming ministry of the adult Jesus. Finally, we witness the meeting between Mary and Elizabeth, mothers of Jesus and John, before either man has been born.

Advent draws us back to the beginning, while, at the same time, anticipating what will come at the end. Each reading calls us to wake up, shape up, and get ready. Now is a time of preparation and also a time of action. We get ready for Christ's coming by reaching out with kindness, compassion, and justice.

Now is the Time!

This season, we are called to stand up, to lift up our heads and take notice of the world around us. Where do we see God's love already at work? Where do we see a need for God's love to be shared?

At Zion, there are many opportunities for us to witness and share God's love during this holiday season: through service opportunities like Alternative Giving and the Giving Tree; through social gatherings like Advent Parish Night (Sunday, December 5th at 6:30 PM) and Midweek Advent Gathering (Wednesdays in December at 7:00 PM); and, of course, through worship. Don't miss this year's Christmas Program on Sunday, December 12th at 10:00 AM and our Christmas Eve Services at 5:00 PM and 8:00 PM!

During this hectic time of year, Advent invites us to take a step back from the mania and to act with purpose and love. As you engage in service, celebration, and praise this coming month, may God's love touch your heart and pull you closer into God's presence.

Congregation Council Highlights

The Council met via Zoom conference call on November 18th. Below are the highlights of that meeting.



- The Treasurer's Report reflected a positive balance at the end of October. Zion's financial picture is healthy. Please see page 9 for an update.
- Zion's Endowment Committee has calculated that \$25,148.72 will be available from Endowment Fund earnings to support new ministry opportunities in 2022. This number is obtained by taking 3% of the 3-year average of the balance in the Endowment Fund.
- There will be a Special Meeting of the Congregation on Sunday, December 12th at 11 a.m.
- Pastor Kat and the Worship & Music committee have scheduled Christmas Eve services for 5 p.m. (Bell Choir) and 8 p.m. (Parish Choir). On Christmas Day, there will be a pre-recorded worship service available on our YouTube channel.
- Pastor Kat is offering a mid-week Advent Gathering at the CEB on Wednesdays in December. Please see the article below for more information.
- The Sunday School Christmas Program will take place during the December 12th Second Sunday Single Service at 10 a.m.
- The church sanctuary will be decorated for Christmas on Saturday, December 4th at 9 a.m. Please contact Joanne Rupp if you would like to help.
- A number of local churches have formed the Hunterdon County Ecumenical Council for the purpose of partnering with school nurses to assist families in need during the holiday season. Zion's Council voted to donate \$3,000 to provide gift cards to these families.
- The water heater on the second floor of the CEB is being replaced.
- Pastor Kat's installation will be taking place in January or February. The date will be set in cooperation with the Synod.
- Pastor Kat presented three options to the Council for a visioning/innovating opportunity in the coming year. The Council discussed the opportunities and asked for more information, which Pastor Kat will provide at the December meeting.

\$15- Trinity Place Shelter

Trinity Place's mission is "To help homeless lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, or queer (LGBTQ) youth and young adults in New York City to safely transition out of the shelter system and grow into independent, positive, and productive adults." New York City has the second highest number of homeless youth of any major city. It is estimated that 40% of homeless youths identify as LGBTQ. There are only 250 -350 beds that are specifically for LGBTQ. These youths often experience abuse and trauma in other shelters and on the street. 
