A New Beginning

No doubt, many people thought death on the cross was the end for Jesus, but we know that it was just the beginning. The women discover the empty tomb and hear the good news: Jesus is not dead but is alive! This news marks a cosmic shift. Empire, injustice, and death are not allowed to have the last word – God does.

In today's context, many of us feel burdened by disheartening news that seems to herald an ending – war abroad, political tension at home, and a broken society still reeling from the effects of a two-year pandemic. It can sometimes be difficult to see how God's victory over death all those years ago still has meaning for us today.

In worship this month, we will hear readings from the book of Revelation that remind us our experience is not a new one. The first audience of Revelation also felt hopeless and weighed down by their current circumstances. They too may have wondered what difference Jesus' death and resurrection made. The vision John shares with them reveals once more that God always has the last word and that this last word is one of justice and renewal.

An Installation!

As a congregation, we are embracing our own new beginning with a service of installation on Sunday, May 15th at 3:00 PM. This will be a time to celebrate our ministry together and look forward with hope. Together we will affirm that God is still at work among us creating new life and new possibilities.

I pray that you will join me for this festive day as we witness God's presence in our midst and listen for how God is calling us into the future.

Endowment Fund News

Our first Endowment Sunday for 2022 will be on Mother's Day, May 8th. The remaining Endowment Sundays for 2022 will be Father's Day, June 19th, and All Saints Sunday, November 6th.

There is \$25,148 from the Endowment Fund earnings available for new ministry opportunities in 2022. This is determined by taking 3% of a 3-year average of the fund. The Church Council is open to suggestions on ways to use the funds to support our ministries. YTD, \$1,500 has been donated to the NJ Synod Compensation Aid Fund and \$5,000 to Lutheran Disaster Response for the Eastern Europe Crisis, leaving a current balance of \$18,648 remaining to support 2022 ministries.



Please consider giving to the Zion Lutheran Church Endowment Fund on May 8th as a tribute to all mothers or to commemorate and celebrate a significant milestone in your family's church life such as a baptism, confirmation, or wedding. Keep in mind that the Endowment Fund only grows with contributions from members and friends of Zion – those who share the vision of not only a living memorial for loved ones, but also recognize that upon maturity the fund will provide significant monetary grants for many new mission-oriented programs ... forever.


