## A Message from Pastor Kat

## We are Called

One of the most sacred parts of a life of faith is discerning our call. How does God desire for us to use our gifts in service to the world? Where is God leading us next? In our individual as well as our church life, discerning our call is an ongoing process. This can be hard for those of us who really enjoy finding our groove and sticking with it. Sometimes, God calls us to a new thing when we aren't quite prepared for it.

This is the case for Elisha when he is called by Elijah to follow in Elijah's footsteps as prophet. Elisha has a hard time letting go of the groove that he's established with his family as a farmer. When Elisha asks to be allowed to bid his parents goodbye, Elijah rebukes him for his hesitation. In response, Elisha kills the oxen pulling his plow and hosts a feast for his community, a gesture that shows his readiness to assume the mantle of leadership.

## How is God calling to Zion?

If discerning our individual call can be difficult, discerning the call of a community and church to which we belong can sometimes be even more challenging! Communal discernment involves conversation and listening – having the courage to speak up as well as being open to what others have to say.

As we prepare to head into a new program year, God is calling to us to consider some new directions for our community. How may Sunday mornings need to change as our worship experience evolves in light of the pandemic? How do we stay connected to families with school-age children and make space for them in church activities when many young people and their families have multiple commitments on their time? How do we stay grounded in the traditions of our community while being consider-ate of new realities in our current context?

As we consider where God is leading us as a congregation, I pray that you will have courage to lift your voice and ears to hear the voices of your brothers and sisters in Christ here at Zion Lutheran Church.

## **Congregation Council Highlights**

The Council met via Zoom conference call on July 21st. Below are the highlights of that meeting.

- Vacation Bible School went very well, despite ending early due to Covid.
- The Parish Life committee has two upcoming events planned the July 30th outing to see the Big Fuss at Sunken Silo, and the August 5th Sip & Solve at the home of Shellie & Eric Evers. Please see page 4 for more details.
- A decision needs to be made about the proceeds from the 2022 Tag Sale, as Family Promise is no longer sending children to camp at Cross Roads.
- Planning is underway for the September 10th 5K Fun Run/Walk. Please see page 8 for more information.
- The Open Forum held for gathering feedback from the congregation regarding the fall worship schedule was successful, with 30 people in attendance. All appreciated the opportunity to express their opinions.
- The Council reviewed the CEB Use Policy, as it was adopted in 2014. It was determined that the policy does not need to be updated.
- A locking mechanism is being purchased for the front door of the church, which will enable the door to be locked and unlocked remotely.
- Discussion was held regarding the Youth & Family Ministry position. There is great value in having the position staffed, however there is concern about the ability to sustain the position financially.
- The Council reviewed their 2022 goal of adding 14 core families. Events like the 5K should be a great opportunity to attract new people to Zion.

### Women of Zion Balance Class — Wednesday, August 10th, at 7 p.m.



## **Stewardship Review**

## Second Quarter General Fund Giving 2022

Our 2022 Spending Plan was based on a projected income of \$373,500 from Zion's members. This projection is comprised of giving from 49 pledging families of \$273,000 and an estimate from Plate (giving via the collection plate during service), special services (unique one-time gifts) and giving from 40 non-pledging families for a total of \$100,500. By the second quarter, we have received a total of \$220,700 or 59% of our year end estimate of \$373,500. Included in this is the pre-




pledged amount (\$61,200) received in December. On a positive note, 33 families have met or are ahead of pledge by \$53,100. This includes 8 families who have completed their pledge for 2022. On the other hand, 16 pledging families are below their year to date pledge by \$6,800.

The pledged amount is 134% of a mid-year point. The non-pledged amount is only 76% of our estimate. The combined total is 118%.

### Zion Giving - The Bigger Picture

The congregation has been generous in giving to areas outside the budget needs. Beyond our giving to our core ministries, Special Appeals and Other Income have been \$60,700 and account for 22% of the total giving. The Special Appeals amount reflects giving to eleven separate appeals so far this year. The Other Income amount reflects Endowment Mission Outreach, the Capital Reserve, and Memorials & Bequests received this year.



Please note that giving to our core ministries, i.e. our budget, should be our "first-fruit giving"; our highest priority. That means giving proportionately and striving toward or achieving the 10% tithe goal. Our current rate of giving indicates that there is a shortfall in supporting these core ministries of Zion. At mid-year, this is estimated to be \$21,000. Second-mile giving should be just that — giving after you have addressed your first-mile proportion. We are blessed at Zion that many of us can give beyond our first-mile giving. However, this should not be at the expense of meeting the need to fully support our ministries funded by the budget.
