## A Message from Pastor Kat

#### **Carrying the Cross**

For those who first followed him, Jesus was a breath of a fresh air, a sign of new life in a difficult age. He saw those who had been overlooked or rejected and invited them to his table. He offered healing to the suffering and bread to the hungry. For those who had felt lost in the dark, Jesus was a beacon of hope.

For many of us today, our faith and calling to follow Christ brings us great joy and meaningful purpose. And yet, we also know that a life of faith does not come without challenge or trial. Following the path that we imagine Jesus would desire for us involves sacrifice. Discipleship comes with a cost.

Jesus is up front about this cost. He speaks about the tension that his followers might experience in their intimate relationships. He urges his followers on several occasions to "give up their possessions" or to "sell their possessions and give the money to the poor."

This month's readings all share a common theme. Each story in some way references material resources and wealth, and how we are called to sacrifice, steward, shrewdly manage, and be generous with these resources – all for the sake of creating a world that mirrors God's intensions.

#### **Supporting God's Mission**

The fall, we leap into a new program year. Sunday School and Confirmation classes begin this month as well as regular weekly rehearsals for our choirs and musical groups. None of this happens without your time, energy, and effort.

As we begin preparing for a new year of learning, growth, and ministry activities, I urge you to consider – how is God calling you to sacrifice, steward, shrewdly manage, and be generous with your resources for the sake of God's work in this place?

It is my prayer that, as a congregation, we will continue to make the choice of carrying the cross for the sake of new life and hope for our congregation and community.

#### Two days of sharing God's grace in August — First Thursday and Youth Service Third Saturday

Volunteers were kept busy the entire time chopping, grating and squeezing (cabbage, carrots, onions, jalapenos, peppers, cheese and limes) - yes, there are modern age kitchen appliances and prepacked foods, but when you have volunteers all you need is a lot of cutting boards, peelers, knives, and box graters!

#### **Endowment Fund News**

#### **NEXT ENDOWMENT SUNDAY NOVEMBER 6th**

The final Endowment Sunday for 2022 will be All Saints Sunday, November 6th.

There was \$25,148 from the Endowment Fund earnings available for new ministry opportunities in 2022. This is determined by taking 3% of a 3-year average of the fund. The Church Council is open to suggestions on ways to use the funds to support our ministries. YTD \$1,500 has been donated to the NJ Synod Compensation Aid Fund, \$5,000 to Lutheran Disaster Response for the Eastern Europe Crisis and \$500 has been earmarked for the New Jersey Synod Visioning Process Training, leaving a balance of \$18,148 still available to support 2022 ministries.
