# A Message from Pastor Kat

#### Wake Up!

This Advent, Jesus urges his disciples and us to "keep awake" as we await his coming (Luke 24:42-44). Vigilance is necessary as there will not necessarily be any obvious warning signs before Jesus' arrival.

This may seem like a particularly difficult assignment in a season where the dark nights stretch to their longest and daylight is in short supply. Many of us are also busy with lengthy to-do lists that demand much of our energy and attention. How are we to stay alert in such a time as this?

I don't think Jesus means for us to pull an all-nighter or imbibe an extra shot of caffeine to keep awake. The wakefulness Jesus describes would be better served by taking special care of our bodies and minds, as well as by setting healthy boundaries around tasks and responsibilities.

#### Sitting in Darkness

The human body needs darkness to get proper rest. This is why certain light-emitting electronics, like phones and computers, can play havoc with our circadian rhythms and prevent us from sleeping well.

In Advent, we embrace the darkness that lengthens around us. We are invited to take time to spiritually rest our souls, to take a break from the overstimulating light and noise of modern life. Then, we can see more clearly and notice more quickly God's presence.

I pray you find time this Advent to sit in darkness and rest, so that you can then recognize and embrace the light of Christ shining in your life.

# **Church Council Highlights**

The Church Council met via Zoom conference call on October 27th and November 17th. Below are the highlights of those meetings.



- The Worship & Music committee reported that Christmas Eve services will take place at 5:00 and 8:00 p.m. Musical offerings will be provided by the Bell Choir at 5 p.m. and the Parish Choir at 8 p.m.
- The 8:30 a.m. service is in need of worship assistants greeters, ushers, and assisting ministers.
- There is concern about the number of volunteers available to serve at Faith Kitchen on the third Saturday of each month. If we are unable to secure more volunteers, we may not be able to continue with the Saturday days of service. The first Thursday opportunities to serve continue to be well attended.
- The Council voted to receive seven new members into the congregation at the 11 a.m. service on November 20th. They are Melanie Bychkowski, Josh & Kelly Clark, Allyson Janssen, Sara Reilly, and Michele & Todd Stevens.
- Sunday School has been averaging 15-20 kids per Sunday (grades PK-12).
- The Tewksbury Township fire marshal has determined that there are violations at the church that need to be addressed, including the need for a second means of egress. Helen Livingston, Property committee chairperson, is working with the fire marshal to determine next steps.
- David Blackwood attended the November 17th meeting to share an evangelism opportunity with the Council. The
  Gideons have created a program called "Conversations" that will train members in learning to share their faith in new
  ways. The Evangelism committee is sponsoring a training session for January 14th at the CEB.
- The Finance committee has completed their final draft of the 2023 proposed budget, to be presented to the congregation at the Special Meeting on December 4th.
- The Worship & Music committee will be decorating the church for Christmas on Saturday, 12/10, at 9 a.m. Volunteers are welcome!
- Donations from the congregation for the Thanksgiving Adopt-a-Family program benefitting the Harvest Family Success Center yielded enough contributions to complete 55 meals.
- The Social Ministry committee is planning a Feed My Starving Children MobilePack for May 19-20, 2023.
- Halloween Hospitality was a success over 200 bags were handed out to trick-or-treaters.
- The Sunday School Christmas pageant will take place on December 18th at a 10 a.m. single service.
- This year's Stewardship campaign focused on Blessing Future Generations, with an emphasis on the need to be able to financially support the Director of Youth & Family Ministries position. Thus far, 17 families have increased their pledge or submitted a pledge for the first time. We have not yet met our goal for supporting the Youth & Family position. Zion's ability to minister to our youth and families will be significantly impacted if we cannot hire a new Director.
- The Nominating committee has completed their slate for 2023 Council nominees. Nominated for a 2-year term on Council are Colin Brokaw, Ken Bryson (second term), Janet Hornich, and Rebecca Melick. Donna Reilly is being nominated to fill a 1-year term.

  - \* Debra Kaufman and Anita Zarate for hosting the Women of Zion Thanksgiving Dinner.




### Tewksbury Tree & Menorah Lighting — December 11th

### Notes from Zion's Financial Secretary

#### Contribution Statements via email:

Members can now elect to have their quarterly/annual contribution statements sent via email. You must agree to receive statements electronically and provide the email address that you would like to have them sent to. Our Parish Administrator will be sending out information and instructions on how to sign up for this option. This will not be done automatically. Look for additional information from the Parish Office and, if interested, please respond before the end of the year. If you do not ask for electronic statements, they will continue to be printed. These will be mailed before the end of January.



Three additional options are now available for those giving electronically using Vanco. They are:

- 1. Twice a month (1<sup>st</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup>)
- 2. Quarterly gifts process every three months after the start date.
- 3. Annual gifts process every year to the date after its start date.

If you already use Vanco and would like to take advantage of one of these new options, log into your account and follow the steps below. Alternatively, you may contact John Rustwick at jrustwick@gmail.com.

- \* Under Transactions, click on the Edit button.
- \* Under Frequency, click on the dropdown arrow.
- \* Select the option you want (there are now 6)
- \* Save the changes
