- Gerry Dehkes, chair of the Director of Youth & Family Ministry search committee, presented Jaime VanNostrand as the committee's recommended candidate for the position. Following a time of questions & answers, the council discussed the motion to offer the position to Jaime, and voted to approve. Jaime will begin her work at Zion on July 1st.
- Pastor Kat will be on vacation from July 10th—23rd. Judy Formalarie will provide pulpit supply on the 16th and 23rd, and Rev. Ingrid Wengert from Zion Long Valley will provide pastoral care in the event of any emergencies.

- Zion's architect will be delivering renderings this month of the two options for the second means of egress at the church. Helen Livingston will then seek bids for the work.
