# A Message from Pastor Kat

#### A Blessing Worth Fighting For

All summer we have been hearing stories about the ancestors of God's people from the book of Genesis. As we step into August, we hear a well-known story about Abraham's grandson, Jacob, who wrestles a mysterious "man" – potentially God in disguise! This "man" puts Jacob's hip out of joint before finally giving heed to Jacob's demand for a blessing.

During this conversation, Jacob gets a new name. Just like his grandfather who is renamed to reflect his character as "father of nations," Jacob's new name tells us about his character too as "one who wrestles with God." Jacob's new name is Israel. Later, this name is used to refer to all God's people, the Israelites.

We are not so different from Jacob and our ancestors, the Israelites. We too wrestle with God – to find meaning, to understand our purpose and the world in which we live. We too know that there are some things worth are worth fighting for – even if we are left scarred by the experience.

In the beginning of August, we also celebrate our congregation's anniversary. Three-hundred and nine years ago, a group of freed slaves and German immigrants thought that a church home was something worth fighting for. Our first pastor, Justus Falckner wrote about this in the hymn, "Rise, O Children of Salvation":

Saints and martyrs long before us firmly on this ground have stood; see their banner waving o'er us, conqu'rors through the Savior's blood. Ground we hold, whereon of old fought the faithful and the bold.

Today, we continue to strive to bring God's blessing to our congregation and community – to feed the hungry, to give shelter to the homeless, and to connect all kinds of people to the grace of God.

# **Church Council Highlights**

The Church Council met via Zoom conference call on July 13th. Below are the highlights of that meeting.



- Zion will celebrate our 309th anniversary on August 6th with a reception on the church lawn following 9:30 a.m. worship.
- Jaime VanNostrand, Director of Youth & Family Ministry, reported that she has hit the ground running and expressed her enthusiasm for the opportunity to serve at Zion.
- The Property committee has received renderings from the architect for the required second means of egress at the church. The committee is aiming to have a minimum of three bids from local contractors by the end of September.
- The Communications committee has added an "I'm New" page to Zion's website to welcome visitors.
- The congregation raised \$675 for ELCA Good Gifts in support of vulnerable LGBTQ youth. The council approved a motion to add \$325 from Endowment Mission Outreach funds to make a total donation of \$1,000.
- The Stewardship committee is planning at Time & Talent campaign for fall.

# **Stewardship Review**

## 2023 Second Quarter General Fund Giving

Our 2023 Spending Plan was based on a projected income of \$373,500 from members. This was comprised of pledges from 46 families of \$274,000 and an estimate from 47 non-pledging families of \$99,500. We received pre-pledges of \$58,500 in December. Through June, seven families met their total 2023 pledge. We have received a total of \$226,100 or 62% of our year end estimate.



- 30 families have met or are ahead of pledge by \$53,000. Most of the surplus is from the seven families who have completed their pledges (\$51,100).
- On the flip side, 16 pledging families are below their year-to-date pledge by \$8,000. In total, 13 families (14%) have made no contribution to our operating expenses.
- Actual giving from pledging families (\$182,000) is over 133% of a 2nd quarter milestone.
- Actual non-pledge income (\$44,100) is at 98% of the expected 2nd quarter milestone.
- Actual total giving (\$226,100) is 124% of a 2nd quarter milestone.

#### **Additional Generosity**

Members have provided support in areas outside of the General Fund.

- Members have given \$12,200 in support of nine special appeals.
- Members have given \$4,200 in support of memorials and various other areas.
- Total giving to all causes is \$232,500.

#### **Stewardship Special Appeal**

Twelve families responded to the special appeal to support our new Director of Youth and Family Ministry.

- Five made a one-time contribution.
- Three made a new pledge.
- Four updated their previous pledge amount.
