ANNUAL MEETING

Annual Meeting of the Congregation — Sunday, January 28th

The 2024 Annual Meeting of the Congregation will be held at the Christian Education Building at 11 a.m. on Sunday, January 28th. The purpose of the meeting is to receive the 2023 Annual Report, approve the 2024 church budget, and install 2024 Council members.

Church Council Highlights

The Church Council met via Zoom conference call on December 21st. Below are the highlights of that meeting.



- Council approved the 2024 budget to be presented to the congregation in January.
- The Annual Meeting of the Congregation will be held on January 28th at 11 a.m. at the Christian Education Building, following 10 a.m. worship at the church. The purpose of the meeting is to receive the 2023 Annual Report, approve the 2024 budget, and install the 2024 council. A potluck luncheon will follow the meeting.
- The Property committee has received one bid for the construction work to be done at the church and is hoping to get two more before the end of January.
- The Social Ministry committee is providing a new service opportunity that begins in January. Five volunteers will be needed once a month to travel to the Open Cupboard Food Pantry's Washington location to assist with sorting items in the pantry and other needs.
- The balance of the 2023 Endowment Mission Outreach funds was distributed, and there will be \$25,850 in Endowment Fund earnings available for mission outreach in 2024.
- In February and March, the Evangelism committee will be sponsoring opportunities for guided meditation sessions on Tuesday evenings at the church, to which the local community is invited.
- Correspondence was received from one of the military care package recipients, thanking Zion for their ongoing support.
