A Message from Pastor Kat

It's A Promise

This Lenten season, we hear lessons from scripture about the covenants, or promises, that God makes to God's people – to Noah, to Abraham, to God's people in the wilderness, to God's people in exile. In each instance, God pledges to be in relationship with God's people and to make a new way for God's people.

In Jesus, we see God's promise fulfilled in the flesh. Through Jesus, God draws us even closer and shows us once more how to live abundantly and with grace. As Lent draws to a close at the end of this month, we will walk a sacred journey alongside Jesus and the disciples during Holy Week. During this week, the services and readings from scripture invite us to join the crowds of people who first welcomed Jesus into Jerusalem, the holy city, with the words, "Hosanna! Save us!" and later condemned him with the words, "Crucify him! Crucify him!"

During Holy Week, we relive the final days of Jesus and hear how he stays true to his mission and fulfills the promise of choosing love for us, God's people, and for all of creation.

An Easter Miracle

Holy Week ends with a celebration of a mysterious and wondrous miracle: Jesus' death on the cross is not the end of the road. The empty tomb revealed on Easter Sunday tells a story of new life, not death, and shows us how God once more paves a new way for God's people: a way of eternal life.

Perhaps you are struggling to feel God's love or to see the path forward in your own life. Wherever you might find yourself this Lent, know that God's promise rings true for you even now: God is with you, and God will make a way.

Church Council Highlights

The Church Council met via Zoom conference call on February 15th. Below are the highlights of that meeting.



- Stewardship chair Tom Held made a presentation to the council highlighting 2023 giving trends and 2024 projections.
- Candlelight Meditation sessions at the church will take the place of a Midweek Lenten Gathering this year. The Evangelism committee will be providing Zion materials for any visitors who attend.
- The Social Ministry committee will be bringing back the Feed My Starving Children MobilePack on May 31st—June 1st.
- Council members noted that the February 10th Council Retreat was especially helpful in focusing on goals for 2024.
- Jaime VanNostrand shared highlights from her January trip to New Orleans for the ELCA Youth Ministry Network's annual conference, and thanked the council for supporting her opportunity to attend.
- The Parish Life committee is planning three events for March Parents Night Out on 3/8, The Big Fuss at Sunken Silo Brew Works on 3/23, and the Stations of the Cross at St. John Neumann on 3/29 (followed by Women of Zion luncheon).
- Helen Livingston joined the meeting to present the council with a proposal for the construction of the second means of egress at the church. Despite Helen's diligent work in contacting at least a dozen contractors over the last year, with the goal of gathering three estimates, this company is the only one who has submitted a bid. As such, Helen asked the council to approve the estimate, and discussion was held around the suitability of this contractor. Helen was asked to obtain two reviews of their recent works, to ensure previous customers had a good experience. Helen will report back to council at the March 14th meeting.
- Zion's Congregational Policies Manual has not been updated since 2014, and a review of all policies is overdue. Council will
 be working in the coming months to look at all existing policies for potential changes and updating.
