A Pentecostal Climax

In many ways, the season of Easter, which we've been living in throughout this past month, reaches its climactic moment in the Day of Pentecost. This church festival marks the end of the Easter season and the culmination of Jesus' teachings to the disciples during Easter. In his post-resurrection appearances and his pre-passion discourse, Jesus prepares the disciples to be his body in the world after his earthly ministry has concluded. God will now work through them, bringing healing and forgiveness to a hurting world.

We have been catching glimpses of what this post-resurrection church looks like in readings from the Book of Acts, but, on the Day of Pentecost, we see how it all begins: with the Holy Spirit raining down with wind and fire and words of hope spoken in tongues to be understood by all people.

We Are Christ's Body

Sometimes, we forget just how powerfully Christ through the Holy Spirit is present in us and in our lives. Pentecost reminds us that God does wondrous things through us, Christ's body. We live in an age when the scope of evil and injustice in the world can make us feel powerless, but the Pentecost story shows us that we are powerful insofar as God's Spirit is acting through us to bring about God's grace-filled reign.

This month, I pray that, remembering God's Spirit has been poured into you in your baptism and abides in you still, will empower and inspire you – filling you with hope for the future.

Church Council Highlights

The Church Council met on May 22nd. Highlights from that meeting are below.

- Over 400 Operation Christmas Child gift boxes were packed on May 11th with the help of Sunday School children, parents, teachers, and mentors.
- The Christian Education program year concluded on May 18th. Families marked the occasion with a Sunday School closing celebration and a miniature golf outing.
- Over \$6,000 was raised at the Tag Sale. With reserves from past years, we were able to send \$10,000 to Family Promise. The plan is to continue to round up Tag Sale proceeds to a donation of \$10,000 for as long as reserves last.
- The Parish Life committee is sponsoring three events in June: a trip to Long Valley Peonies on June 1st, a Crochet Class on June 12th, and a group outing to the Somerset Patriots baseball game on June 28th.
- The Social Ministry committee is sponsoring a blood drive at the CEB on July 10th.
- The annual 5K Fun Run/Walk has been scheduled for September 6th.
- Pastor Kat shared that she and Rev. Levi Powers got engaged on May 18th and thanked the council members for their ongoing support of the transitions in her personal life.

Endowment Fund News

Our second Endowment Sunday for 2025 will be on Father's Day, June 15th. The final Endowment Sunday for 2025 will be All Saints Day, November 2nd.

There was \$26,814 from the Endowment Fund earnings available for new ministry opportunities in 2025. This is determined by taking 3% of a 3-year average of the fund. The Church Council is open to suggestions on ways to use the funds to support our ministries. YTD \$1,500 has been donated to the NJ Synod Compensation Aid Fund, \$4,425 to Feed My Starving Children, \$2,000 to Operation Christmas Child,

Compensation Aid Fund, \$4,425 to Feed My Starving Children, \$2,000 to Operation Christmas Child, \$5,000 to Lutheran Disaster Response, \$1,000 to the Good News Home, \$250 to Clinton Township Relay for Life, \$1,500 to the House Next Door retreat for pastors, and \$420 for Candlelight Meditation leadership, leaving a current balance of \$10,719 still available to support 2025 ministries.

Please consider giving to the Zion Lutheran Church Endowment Fund on June 15th as a tribute to all fathers or to commemorate and celebrate a significant milestone in your family's church life, such as a baptism, confirmation or a wedding. Always keep in mind that the Endowment Fund only grows with contributions from members and friends of Zion -- those who share the vision of not only a living memorial for loved ones, but also recognize that upon maturity, the fund will provide significant monetary grants for many new mission-oriented programs ... forever.




Thank You to Zion's Handbell Choir
