Since Zion's founding congregation was made up of one-third freed slaves and two-thirds German immigrants, we can imagine they were hoping to find community and belonging as well as a foundation in the word of God. Many would have been starting new lives in a new place and, no doubt, hoped to find support from their siblings in Christ.

I doubt those first members of Zion all those years ago could imagine what lay ahead—revolution, war, hardship, as well as joys, milestones, and shared achievements. This month, I invite you along with our stewardship committee to embrace the theme of hopes and dreams. Imagine with us a future for Zion today, and discern with us how each of us, with the help of the Spirit, can be a part of making these hopes and dreams come true.

Lunch Bunch — October 9th

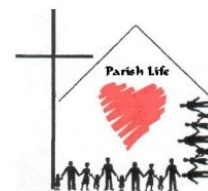

If it's October, it's Stewardship Campaign time! This year our theme is "Dreams Become Reality Through Our Gifts." You'll be hearing from us during Sunday services as fellow Zion Members will be sharing their "Dreams for Zion" during Temple Talks, leading up to Commitment Sunday October 19th. Stay tuned!

Endowment Fund News

The final Endowment Sunday for 2025 will be on All Saints Sunday, November 2nd.

There was \$26,814 from Endowment Fund earnings available for ministry opportunities in 2025. This is determined by taking 3% of a 3-year average of the fund. The Church Council is open to suggestions on ways to use the funds to support our ministries. YTD \$1,500 has been donated to the NJ Synod Compensation Aid Fund, \$4,425 to Feed My Starving Children, \$2,000 to Operation Christmas Child, \$5,000 to Lutheran Disaster Response, \$1,000 to the Good News Home, \$250 to Clinton Township's Relay for Life, \$1,500 to the House Next Door Pastors Retreat, \$420 for Candlelight Meditation Leadership, \$2,500 to the Open Cupboard Food Pantry, and \$2,000 for Thanksgiving meals for Harvest Family Success Center, leaving a current balance of \$6,219 available to support 2025 ministries.

Please consider giving to the Zion Lutheran Church Endowment Fund on November 2nd to celebrate All Saints Sunday or to commemorate a significant milestone in your family's church life such as a baptism, confirmation, or wedding. Please keep in mind that the Endowment Fund only grows with contributions from members and friends of Zion -- those who share the vision of not only a living memorial for loved ones, but also recognize that upon maturity, the fund will provide significant monetary grants for many new mission-oriented programs ... forever.

Envelopes marked "Endowment Fund" will be available in the church on November 2nd. If you are worshipping virtually, please consider mailing a check marked "Endowment" to the Parish Office.
